

Resources to meet the state regulations for career readiness

Career Ready PA

Pennsylvania's economic future depends on having a well-educated and skilled workforce that is prepared to meet the current and projected demands of a global, knowledge-based 21st century economy. Learners across the state will be prepared for meaningful engagement in postsecondary education, in workforce training, in career pathways, and as responsible, involved citizens.

In Pennsylvania, 22 Pa. Code § 339.31 requires that all school entities have a written plan on file, approved by the local board of school directors, for the development and implementation of a comprehensive, sequential program of guidance services for kindergarten through 12th grade.

The plan must be designed to promote equal opportunity and address guidance service areas (outlined in 22 Pa. Code § 339.32) and career planning for all students. The plan should integrate the state [Academic Standards for Career Education and Work \(CEW\)](#).

Including employability and career readiness skills in the curriculum is mandated for both K-12 schools and for career & technical schools. K-12 Guidance Plans will be due to be updated in the soon. They will have to be completed on the new portal and uploaded to PDE. More information will be forthcoming to schools when it becomes available from Pennsylvania Department of Education (PDE).

All schools will be asked to address the following in their guidance plans:

The Pennsylvania Career Ready Skills (PA CRS) are social emotional learning progressions that support the development of student competence. By design, the PA CRS reflect priorities to ensure youth are career ready and prepared to meet the demands of the 21st century workforce. The PA CRS are grouped into three domains.

Self-Awareness and Self-Management

Skills to understand and manage behavior, including the abilities to set goals, recognize feelings, and respond effectively to challenges.

Establishing and Maintaining Relationships

Skills that support healthy relationships, including awareness and respect of diversity, and the abilities to communicate and resolve conflicts effectively.

Social Problem Solving

Skills that support students to understand social norms, make responsible choices, and engage effectively in diverse contexts.
