Chapter 339 requires the approved student organizations must be integrated into the career and technical programs. As you can see from the language of the regulations below, it is required that all career and technical programs provide instruction in the areas underlined. When a school is due for the Approved Program Evaluation (every five years), the auditors will be looking at the curriculum to ensure these areas are being addressed.

§ 339.30. Student organizations.

(a) CTSOs shall be an integral part of . the respective vocational education program. Instruction must provide for the <u>development of human relations skills; knowledge of</u> <u>occupations; leadership competencies and positive attitudes towards fulfilling occupational,</u> <u>civic, social and community responsibilities.</u>

There are many ways to use the curriculum. It will work well for schools with a Diversified Occupations Program when the students must meet with the DO instructor at least once a week. The Cooperative Education teacher may use some of the materials during the classes with the Co-op students. The regular career & technical education teacher may use it to provide employability skills instruction which is a requirement of Chapter 4 and is evaluated under the Chapter 339 Approved Program Review. The CTSO advisor can also use the material for leadership training. The following are requirements of teaching employability skills.

Chapter 4.1.2.5 Academic Standards:

Career education and work. Understanding career options in relationship to individual interests, aptitudes and skills including the relationship between changes in society, technology, government and economy and their effect on individuals and careers. Development of knowledge and skill in job-seeking and job-retaining skills and, for students completing vocational-technical programs, the skills to succeed in the occupation for which they are prepared.

Chapter 4.31 (c)

Career & technical education programs must consist of a series of planned academic and vocational-technical education courses that are articulated with one another so that knowledgeand skills are taught in a systematic manner. When appropriate, career & technical education programs must adopt, in program areas for which they are available, industry recognized skills standards and may also include cooperative vocational-technical education and participation in **career & technical student organizations to develop leadership skills**.
